

# TIERS OF SUPPORT AT PETER GREER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

## Classroom Instruction Tier 1 – Powerful and purposeful learning is...

- Differentiated instruction
- offer voices and choice
- fosters student ownership
- is engaging and relevant
- changes the role of teacher from 'lecturer' to facilitator
- co-planning co-teaching and co-assessing with colleagues

### accomplished through...

- Collaboration
- Professional development
- In-service
- Professional Growth Plans (PGPs)
- Allocation of resources

## Classroom Interventions – after teacher notices that a student is presenting academic or social/emotional difficulties:

- Observations are discussed with parents
- Review student file
- View School Based Team notes
- Consult/collaborate with colleagues.
- Classroom based adaptations are planned and implemented (buddy tutor, extended time, adjusted expectations etc.). **Learning Plan is considered.**
- Re-teaching
- Co-planning/Co-teaching/co-assessing
- Try different instructional strategy
- Teacher works with parent to develop a plan
- Before or after school support (i.e. Homework Club)
- Parent-Teacher Conferences
- short-term intervention
- teacher release

Adaptations work; no further action required but monitoring

Adaptations do not solve the difficulty

**Referral to School Based Team (SBT)**

## Referral is made to SBT Chair (LAT) – Tier 2 Intervention

- Consider additional assessment/testing
- Co-plan/co-teach/co-assess
- Assistance for additional adaptations
- Consider in-class support
- Small group intervention
- In-class LAT support
- Pull-out LAT or Literacy Support
- Consider longer-term intervention
- Consider Learning Plan
- Consider ELL support and strategies
- Referral is made to access resources outside the classroom through the SBT
